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Supplementary declarations: timeline reminder

The Northern Ireland Protocol requires traders to complete import declarations for the movement of goods from Great Britain (GB) into Northern Ireland (NI). When you use TSS, you provide the required information in two stages.

Before the goods are moved to NI, you or your haulier provides data to TSS to generate your ENS Safety and Security declaration and to satisfy pre-movement import declaration requirements.

After the goods have moved, you then submit a supplementary declaration to complete the declaration process, normally by the fourth working day of the month following the goods movement. For example with goods moved in June 2021, you should submit your supplementary declaration by 6 July 2021.

Submitting supplementary declarations is:

- a legal requirement and needs to be done to comply with the law
- the final step in your import process

HMRC recognises that it may initially be challenging for traders and hauliers coming to terms with this new process and has extended submission dates with new deadlines outlined in the

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table below. However, there's no reason to delay your supplementary declaration submissions if you're ready to submit sooner.

Movement dates (2021)	Supplementary declaration submission deadlines (2021)
1-13 January	1 May
14-31 January	14 May
1-28 February	1 June
1-31 March	28 June
1-30 April	28 June

Please note that you are not yet required to submit supplementary declarations for any goods that use non-standard customs procedure codes. TSS will contact you in due course about these submissions.

Supplementary declarations: help is on hand

We understand that the declaration processes are new. TSS is on hand to support you with the completion of your supplementary declarations. You can access support by:

• **Talking to a TSS customs expert** by calling the TSS helpline on 0800 060 8888 (from 7:30am to 10:30pm seven days a week) or by raising a case on the TSS portal. Through this process you can get access to experts who will be able to guide you on the information you are required to provide for your supplementary declaration and where to obtain this.

If required, we can arrange one-to-one sessions using screen sharing technology to walk through your supplementary declaration submission and help you to understand the process.

This guide helps you to navigate the online tariff tool on gov.uk to determine whether tariffs apply to your goods if they are controlled.

Supplementary declarations: new functionality to help you

If you are adding item-level information in the supplementary declaration, the portal will use the information provided in the 'Commodity Code' and 'Country of (Preferential) Origin' fields to provide personalised help text and entry suggestions for certain other fields. You can find detailed guidance on the supplementary declaration process <u>here</u>.

Here are a few examples of how the latest TSS updates will help you:

- Pop-up help text will make import rules easier to find
- **Personalised drop-down menus** will help identify the correct codes for your goods and provide you with a plain-English description of the code
- Pop-up help text validates which fields you need to populate, based on the type of goods you have moved

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- **Document codes search functionality** will help you locate additional documents more quickly when submitting your declarations
- User-friendly CDS errors explanations will help you identify issues and submit your declarations correctly
- Obtaining your previous movement information from your supplementary declaration, helping you to link your declarations together when making a submission by displaying the associated ENS and SFD references and arrival information
- Copy goods item information from one supplementary declaration to another, helping you to duplicate goods item information, if you transport the same type of goods on a regular basis, and reduce time expended on repeating supplementary declarations

TSS in action: using the API to process 26k supplementary declarations

Pharmaceutical wholesaler, Ethigen has been a user of the TSS API since its launch at the beginning of this year. Now that the API fully supports supplementary declarations, Ethigen has used this facility to process their supplementary declarations.

TSS advised Ethigen to apply for the UK Trader Scheme (UKTS) in order to become authorised to declare their goods as 'not at risk' of moving to the EU (ie Ireland) so that duty was not paid unnecessarily.

In parallel to the UKTS application process, the TSS API team engaged with Ethigen's Lead Developer, Richard Bradley, to support the development and test of their API process.

UKTS authorisation was approved on the evening of Thursday 13 May and so Ethigen began the process of using the API to process their supplementary declarations on Friday 14 May, making several submissions with manageable chunks of data that progressed over the weekend. The process was completed on Monday 17 May, with Ethigen successfully clearing a total of 26,000 supplementary declarations.

TSS invites other traders with more than 50 supplementary declarations for submission per month to consider using the updated API to reduce the manual effort involved. See the new <u>API functional guide</u> for more information.

TSS in action: wine wholesaler shown how to create new lines on their supplementary declaration

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Mark Jefferson Wines Ltd, a Belfast-based wholesaler of wine to the licenced trade, recently asked for advice on how to group together multiple items in a consignment when completing supplementary declarations.

A TSS agent initially emailed a video and step-by-step guide to support the trader, followed by a phone call and one-to-one virtual meeting to walk them through the declaration submission process.

During the meeting the TSS agent explained that because each of the goods in the consignment had a separate commodity code, each item required a separate line in the supplementary declaration. The TSS agent showed the trader how to create new lines and save the inputted data.

The trader was very happy with this bespoke support from TSS, and as a result, they are now feeling more confident when completing their supplementary declarations.
