Weekly bulletin: Key updates to support you

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New TSS features and NICTA improvements coming in June

There will be an update to the TSS Portal in June, as well as improvements to the Northern Ireland Customs and Trade Academy (NICTA) website in mid-June.

These changes will require a short downtime of the portal, which is **currently planned for Sunday 19 June 2022 from 17:00 to 22:00.**

These changes are based on the feedback you have provided and will include:

- Service enhancements to **make the TSS Portal easier to use** and **help users to avoid making errors when completing declarations**
- Introduction of the **auto-generation of Final Supplementary Declarations** (see [last week's bulletin](#))
- Updates to our advice including a new guide on **document codes**

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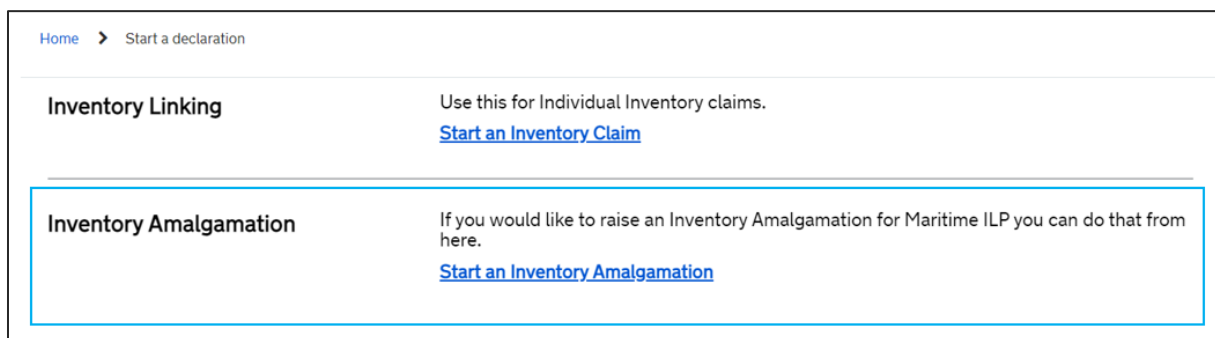
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New functionality will make it easier to clear shipments through maritime inventory-linked port movements

Currently, you can identify and claim cargo that has been shipped into an inventory-linked port in Northern Ireland through the TSS Portal. You can then clear the cargo through customs by completing a Full Frontier Declaration.

The inventory is identified through the Unique Consignment Number (UCN) generated for each part of a trader's shipment when a claim is raised in the TSS Portal. Currently, the process for amalgamating several UCNs under one Master Unique Consignment Number (MUCN) to clear the whole shipment of goods under one declaration is manual, often requiring the assistance of TSS agents.

In June, TSS will introduce a system supported process for inventory amalgamation for maritime ILP movements, making the process for amalgamating several UCNs under one MUCN simpler and more streamlined. Traders will be able to request an amalgamation from the Declarations page on the TSS Portal.



The trader will be able to specify in the system exactly which inventory claims they wish to be amalgamated. TSS will then liaise with the relevant Community System Provider (CNS) for the destination port to process the amalgamation.

Error code guidance – CDS10001

If you encounter the CDS error code “CDS10001” whilst submitting your declaration for goods movements, it's because a data value is missing for a mandatory field.

Error Message

CDS10001 Missing mandatory field value:
:->Shipment(1)->Item Line(1)->AdditionalDocument(1)->TypeCode;FriendlyName: Document Code Type
ValidationCode: CDS10001;CodeDescription: Obligation error: Mandatory Data Element has not been provided:->Shipment(1)->Item Line(1)->AdditionalDocument(1)->CategoryCode;FriendlyName: Document Code - Category

The error message should point you to the field that should be reviewed. The requirements for that field will vary, based on the requirements for your movement. Please review [this guide](#) for more information relating to the specific row.

To resolve the error code, you need to populate the specified field and resubmit the declaration.

TSS tip: how the 'Tariff Requirements' box helps you complete your Supplementary Declaration

If you're having difficulty completing your Supplementary Declarations, consider using the guidance provided in the Tariff Requirements box.

After you have entered your commodity code and country of origin / country of preferential origin on the goods item level, click the save button to save your progress. A new section should appear near the bottom of the page on the goods item level. This is the 'Tariff Requirements' box.

Y: Other conditions

- Y949: Good other than those described in the footnotes linked to the measure (Reg 267/2012). Council Regulation (EU) No 267/2012 Concerning Restrictive Measures Against Iran. - Import/export allowed after control
OR

- C067: Import authorisation for restricted goods and technologies (Council Regulation (EU) No 267/2012) concerning restrictive measures against Iran and repealing Regulation (EU) No 961/2010. - Import/export allowed after control
OR

- Y069: Goods not consigned from Iran. Council Regulation (EU) No 267/2012 Concerning Restrictive Measures Against Iran and Repealing Regulations (EU) No 961/2010. - Import/export allowed after control

This box provides helpful guidance on:

- The document codes that relate to your goods
- A range of the correct 'Tax Base Unit' options to apply to your goods

Apply for and use your own Duty Deferment Account (DDA)

Using your own Duty Deferment Account (DDA) allows you to delay paying most customs or tax charges when you import goods or release goods from an excise warehouse.

Both traders and agents/intermediaries can apply for a DDA.

As an agent or intermediary, submitting customs declarations on behalf of a trader, you may use either your own DDA or your trader's, provided that your trader has authorised you to act on their behalf.

To apply for a DDA for use in Northern Ireland, please provide all required information for your application to be processed. HMRC aims to process the application as soon as possible but it may be longer before you are able to use your DDA as a Customs Comprehensive Guarantee (CCG) is also needed for all Northern Ireland DDA applications.

Apply to the UK Trader Scheme (UKTS) to declare goods not 'at risk' of moving to the European Union

If you are moving goods from Great Britain to Northern Ireland and those goods are to remain in Northern Ireland, you can declare your goods as being not 'at risk' of moving into the European Union to avoid becoming subject to EU import duty. You will need to become authorised under the UK Trader Scheme (UKTS).

To review the eligibility criteria and make an application, [visit the UK Trader Scheme page on gov.uk](#). We recommend that you allow sufficient time for the application process and apply at least a month before you intend to move your goods.

Some key points to consider:

- You should be moving goods from Great Britain to Northern Ireland, with your goods for sale to, or for final use by end consumers located in the United Kingdom
- You will need to demonstrate that your goods are:
 - Not 'at risk' of moving to the European Union by being able to show records, systems, controls, and evidence of your Great Britain to Northern Ireland movements
 - For sale to, or provided for final use by, end consumers located in the United Kingdom

- You must meet the [qualification criteria](#) for the scheme
