Less than 10 days to go until the UK Trader Scheme closes

There are now less than 10 days to go until the UK Internal Market Scheme (UKIMS) replaces the UK Trader Scheme (UKTS). If your business moves goods into Northern Ireland and is eligible to <u>apply for UKIMS</u>, please make sure you have completed your application.

If your new authorisation is not processed by 30 September when the UKTS closes, then goods moved from GB to NI must be declared 'at risk' unless the applicable duty is zero. If your business is eligible, you can claim back any duties via the Duty Reimbursement Scheme, or you can claim a Customs Duty waiver. Once you're authorised, you can continue to declare goods 'not at risk' and complete declarations using the code 'Northern Ireland remain' (NIREM) under the UKIMS.

Best practice: performing an EORI validity check before processing declarations

To avoid any errors in declarations, we would suggest traders check the EORIs they are using.

You can check the EORIs you intend to use before you begin the declaration process:

- <u>Check here</u> for EU EORIs, including XI EORIs
- <u>Check here</u> for GB EORIs


The Economic Operator System (EOS) also offers an API that can be used to automate checks. More information on this can be found here.

DAERA are now using GVMS for reporting to Sanitary and Phytosanitary inspection facilities

The <u>Department for Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs (DAERA)</u> is now using the <u>Goods Vehicle Movement Service (GVMS)</u> to notify traders of the requirement to report to DAERA Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) inspection facilities for SPS checks and controls. This enhancement will streamline the process for alerting traders that an SPS inspection is required.

What does this mean for me?

In advance of your goods arriving in Northern Ireland and disembarking the ferry you must check the status of your Goods Movement Reference (GMR) to determine whether:


• you may continue the journey to your destination (provided you are not required to report for checks by other control bodies)


or

 you must report to a DAERA SPS inspection facility for application of SPS checks and controls.


How to check your GMR Status in GVMS

Once you have obtained your GMR via GVMS, you should follow the four-step guidance below to determine whether your goods need to report to DAERA inspection facilities on disembarkation.









NOTE: If you are using TSS **GMR Automation** functionality, TSS will display movements that require inspections in the TSS GMR Dashboard. For further information please visit the <u>New GMR "Inspection Required" field page on NICTA.</u>
