What is an Entry Summary Declaration?

- An Entry Summary Declaration is a required form that indicates safety and security data associated to all goods moved from Great Britain (GB) to NI.
- It is the legal responsibility of the carrier to ensure safety and security information is declared via the Entry Summary Declaration. However, other parties (trader, haulier or intermediary) may agree to complete it.

Note: Carrier is defined as the operator of the active means of transport.

How does TSS support Entry Summary Declarations?

- TSS provides a portal for registered traders, carriers and hauliers to provide safety and security information that TSS uses to generate and submit Entry Summary Declarations.
- TSS uses safety and security information from the Entry Summary Declaration and further data provided by the trader to complete import declaration requirements.
